## English

During English sessions pupils listen to and read a range of shared text, using sensory resources and objects of reference. We enjoy fictional stories and poetry, as well as learning from factual texts. Pupils practise (pre) reading and (pre) handwriting skills using the ReadWriteInc scheme and Talk4writing. Pupils develop phonics knowledge and skills enabling them to decode and encode words, building their confidence in reading and writing, grammar, punctuation, spelling and increasing their vocabulary.

## Mathematics

Mathematics sessions this term will cover the areas of; number systems and how we can represent numbers in different ways, fractions, measuring temperature and time, data collection and graph work, as well as position and direction. Pupils will partake in practical and sensory activities, relating to real life situations, as well as practising formal written calculations. Pupils will be encouraged to use the correct mathematical language and will practise measuring using standard and non standard units.

## Physical Education

In physical education, we will be developing our agility and static balance, through reaction and response ball games and floor work.

## Computing

Computing work will concentrate on programming using Scratch.

## Music

Music is an important aspect across the curriculum; pupils enjoy a range of music genres and music from around the world. We listen to familiar songs which cue us in to different subject lessons and have fun playing the class instruments.
